### **JESUS AS A MODEL FOR EVANGELISM**

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How did Dr. Evans' teaching on Jesus and the Samaritan woman challenge your own preconceptions about evangelism and your approach to sharing the good news of the gospel with others?

Note that Jesus addresses both the Samaritan woman's error in her theology and her broken relationships and confronts these issues with the truth of the gospel, but all of this emerges from a shared conversation and relationship. The apostle Paul would later call this kind of approach as "speaking the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15). How have you seen this work out in your own life, that confrontation with the truth works best when you know someone cares about you?

Jesus's opportunity to share the gospel with this Samaritan woman emerges out of a conversation that involves both talking and listening to one another. Think back through your life at some of the best conversations you have had. What characteristics made those conversations memorable and transforming for your life? How might these same characteristics be helpful as you think about conversations in which you share the gospel?
